4 Report of the Secretary

Last year's report opened with a tribute to the outgoing General Secretary, David Chadd. It is with the deepest regret that we now have to inform members of Professor Chadd's death on 8 November 2006 at the age of 63. David had been a member of the Society since 1976, serving as General Secretary from 1986 to 2005, and his contribution to its reinvigoration during those years was wideranging and scarcely quantifiable. But in addition to carrying a considerable administrative burden for nearly twenty years, he also produced for the Society an exemplary edition of the Ordinal of Holy Trinity, Fécamp (published as volumes CXI and CXII), and at his death was engaged on a study of insular monastic office antiphoners which it is hoped will be brought to completion. Links to the address given at David's funeral by Denys Robinson, and to a tribute by his colleagues at the University of East Anglia, can be found on the Society's website (www.henrybradshawsociety.org). A memorial concert, including performances of works by Bach, Haydn and Josquin and choral arrangements of songs by Carl Nielsen, was held at Norwich Cathedral on 16 February 2007.

One of the last Society matters to engage David's attention was the long-running question of reprints of our older volumes, many of them in frequent demand and difficult to find second hand. Here there is real progress to report. In the past we have been unable to reprint as many titles as we would wish, because of the need to effectively destroy a copy of the original issue in the process. However, recent advances in technology have now finally made it possible to reprint our entire back catalogue. Each volume will be digitally photographed at Cambridge University Library, and the resulting CD passed to our publisher, Boydell and Brewer, who will issue a paperback facsimile available for purchase by members of the Society and others at a relatively modest cost. The first tranche of volumes is being photographed at present, and the work will be completed in two further

instalments, with the largest volumes being left to the last. We are sure that many members will welcome this news.

Work is also advanced on our next Main Series volume (CXVII), An Atlas of Saints in Anglo-Saxon Calendars by Dr Rebecca Rushforth; it is hoped that it will be published within 2007. Further titles are in preparation and will be published in due course. In the meantime, members wishing to purchase available Main Series and Subsidia volumes at discounted prices are reminded that they Members' should obtain the special Order Form from the General Secretary (Peter.Jackson14@btinternet.com).

This is the second year in which the *Annual Report* has been posted in electronic format only. As before, any members who wish to receive their own copy either in paper or as an email attachment are asked to inform the Secretary of this requirement (only one such request, for a paper copy, has in fact been received). Similarly, all members of the Society who have email addresses which they have not communicated to the Society, or which have changed since they last did so, are requested to give these details to the Treasurer (hbs.treasurer@googlemail.com).

5 Treasurer's report for 2006

The finances of the Society remain healthy, and well-prepared to fund the volumes in preparation, as well as the proposed digitalisation of our past publications which will form the basis of the new reprint program. These activities are detailed in the Secretary's report for the year.

The Treasurer remains anxious to simplify and clarify the Society's invoicing, though simplifying and clarifying are not always compatible. Suggestions for improvement are always welcome.

Independent examiner's report on the accounts

To the officers of the Henry Bradshaw Society:

As the society's officers you are responsible for preparing the accounts; you consider that the audit and independent examination requirements of the Charities Act 1993 ("the Act") do not apply. My examination has therefore been carried out on a simplified basis designed to meet the requirements of rule 11 of the society's constitution. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be relied on in an audit or full examination under the procedures specified in the General Directions given by the Charity Commisioners under section 43(7)b of the Act. Consequently I neither express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts nor report in accordance with the General Directions issued.

The society has elected to prepare accounts on an accruals basis consistent with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Enterprises. However, income other than subscriptions has been accounted for on a cash received basis, contrary to the use of the accruals basis elsewhere in the accounts. In my opinion, all income should have been recorded on an accruals basis. I am unable to judge the full impact of this departure from the standard.

Subject to any adjustment required to reflect non-subscription income receivable by the society, in my opinion the accounts fairly reflect the state of the society's affairs at 31 December, 2006 and of its surplus for the year then ended.

Notes to the Accounts for the year ended 31 December, 2006

1 Accounting policies

In preparing the accounts, attention has been paid to the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Enterprises (FRSSE), the statement of recommended practice on accounting by charities (SORP 2005) and the Charities Act 1993. The particular accounting policies adopted are described below.

a) Convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention.

b) Investments

Investments held as current assets are stated at nominal value. No investments are currently held.

c) Stocks and work in progress

No valuation is attached to stocks in the society's balance sheet. The value of work in progress, less attributable subscriptions is reflected by the Volumes in preparation and Publications reserve accounts.

d) Income

Subscription income is recognised in the Society's accounts in the year that it falls due, but all other income is recognised when cash is received.
