3 Minutes of the Annual Meeting, 23 April 2010

The one hundred and seventh Annual Meeting of the Society was held on Friday 23 April 2010 at 2 p.m. in the Panizzi Room of the British Library, London.

1. MINUTES

The Minutes of the one hundred and sixth Annual Meeting were confirmed.

2. COMMEMORATION

Commemoration was made of The Rev'd Dr H. E. J. Cowdrey (1926-2009; Chairman of Council, 1986-2000; Honorary Vice-President, 2000-09), and of Professor Virginia Brown (1940-2009).

3. STATEMENTS FROM THE CHAIR

The President remarked that although the Society had reached its 120th anniversary, its origins lie much earlier, in the happy coincidence in 1833 of the re-establishment of the Abbey of Solesmes and the founding of the Oxford Movement.

4. REPORTS

The Reports of the Secretary and the Treasurer were considered. The Treasurer observed that the 2009 Accounts were examined with unprecedented efficiency by Mr Patrick Clinton as Independent Accounts Examiner. He reported that the Society's finances remain in a healthy position overall, and presented the accounts, which were laid out in a clearer format but which no longer displayed reconciliation of figures. The Meeting adopted both Reports; accepted the accounts; recorded a vote of thanks to the Secretary and the Treasurer; and expressed its appreciation of Mr Clinton's services. The Chairman of Council offered particular thanks to the Treasurer for his unstinting work on the Society's behalf.

5. ELECTION OF THE PRESIDENT

Abbott Cuthbert Johnson was elected President for the year 2010–11.

7. ELECTION OF COUNCIL

Mr M. J. Burr and Professor N. J. Morgan were re-elected to Council to serve until 2013, their previous terms having expired in 2010.

Mr N. Orchard had expressed his intention not to seek re-election to Council. Prof. Lapidge and Dr Bell had written to thank him for his invaluable contribution to the Society's publications over the preceding decade, and the Meeting recorded its profuse thanks for his substantial contribution to liturgical studies.

Professor Rankin proposed that Mr C. J. Hodkinson be elected to Council, and it was agreed to discuss the proposal at the Society's next Meeting.

8. INDEPENDENT ACCOUNTS EXAMINER

The Meeting resolved to invite Mr Patrick Clinton to undertake the duties of Independent Accounts Examiner for the financial year 1 January – 31 December 2010.

9. ANNUAL MEETING

The Meeting resolved that the next Annual Meeting of the Society be held on Friday 29 April 2011. This date was subsequently declared a public holiday, and so the date was altered to 10 May 2011.

There being no other business, the Meeting concluded at 2.33 p.m.

4 Report of the Secretary for 2010

This year has been notable as being the first in more than a century in which the Society can claim that very nearly all of its publications are available in print. Boydell & Brewer completed their programme of scanning Main Series volumes for Print-on-Demand, and at the end of the year only volume XVI (Dewick's edition of the Coronation Book of Charles V of France) was awaiting publication. This new availability of old titles has been welcomed from many quarters, and is generating royalty income for the Society which has already gone some way towards offsetting the costs of the investment. It is unfortunate that no new volumes in the Main Series or the Subsidia were issued in 2010, and that members' subscriptions from the year 2007 onwards have not vet been recompensed with a publication, but we hope to remedy this in course of 2011. During the year we have welcomed the following into membership of the Society: Mr S. N. Dulaney (Stayton, Oregon); the Rev'd M. S. Ernest STD (Scarsdale, New York); Dr H. F. Mierau (York); Dr Christine Phillips (Leeds); Mr M. C. Salisbury (Oxford University); Mr A. W. Tanski (Eureka, California); Dr Magnus Williamson (Newcastle University); and the John W. Graham Library, Trinity College, University of Toronto.

5 Treasurer's report for 2010

The Independently Examined Accounts are set out below in the same format as last year. A statement of income and expenditure by volume will be available as usual at the Annual Meeting, together with the accounts to date for 2011.

Only one volume remains to be made available in the Print on Demand project, so the costs for that are nearly complete; but once again, the overall position of the finances at the end of the year remains remarkably close to that at its beginning.

As expected, bank interest was again considerably lower in 2010 than in 2009; and we have to assume that 2011will be nearly as bad. The real value of our publishing reserves is reduced in consequence, although not alarmingly so. There is not much comfort in reflecting on the fact that most charities are in the same position.

The accounts show a fall in subscription income. In part this is normal in our publication cycle, and subscription income recovers when a new main series volume appears. But it was exacerbated last November by an operating system collapse, followed by a change in database access protocol; in consequence, some of the invoicing immediately afterwards failed to invoice properly for 2011. Remedial correspondence after the year end has had a good effect, so that the 2010 accounts are unduly pessimistic on this front.

The finances of the Society remain healthy, and well-prepared to fund the volumes in preparation.

Independent examiner's report on the accounts
