# 3 Minutes of the Annual Meeting, 10 May 2011

The one hundred and eighth Annual Meeting of the Society was held on Tuesday 10 May 2011 at 11.30 a.m. in the Panizzi Room of the British Library, London.

#### 1. MINUTES

The Minutes of the one hundred and seventh Annual Meeting were confirmed.

#### 3. STATEMENTS FROM THE CHAIR

The President thanked the Council for its work over the previous year, and was pleased to note the growth in numbers of the Society's membership.

## 4. REPORTS

The Reports of the Secretary and the Treasurer were considered. The Treasurer pointed out that the expenditure on the scanning of past volumes for print-on-demand is now almost completed, and that royalties will continue to accrue from sales of past volumes, which should in due course offset this investment. The Meeting adopted both Reports; accepted the accounts; recorded a vote of thanks to the Secretary and the Treasurer; and expressed its appreciation of Mr Clinton's services as independent examiner.

# 4 Report of the Secretary for 2011

It is unfortunate that another year has passed without a new publication being issued to members, but one should not deduce from this that the Society has been idle. By the end of the year two substantial volumes had been sent to our publishers, and we hope that both will be in the press very soon, for issue later this year. The first volume of Professor Nigel Morgan's edition of *English Monastic Litanies of the Saints after 1100* will be published in our Main Series over the summer, and will consist of editions of litanies from monastic houses arranged alphabetically from Abbotsbury to Peterborough; a second volume will conclude the edition and provide commentaries and indexes. The other is a further volume in our Subsidia Series, Dr Jesse Billett's study of *The Divine Office in Anglo-Saxon England*.

Every editor of a Henry Bradshaw volume devotes many months, often years, to the furtherance of the Society's charitable objectives, and many other members are hard at work in the preparation of future volumes, which we hope to see in print before long. None of this would be possible, however, without our Publications Committee, and in particular the Chairman of the Society's Council, Michael Lapidge, who will retire from post at this year's Annual Meeting. Professor Lapidge succeeded Dr Cowdrey to the Chair in 2000, but had already acted as publications secretary for fifteen years before that. In this long period of service he has provided a level of editorial care and scholarly rigour in his redaction of every volume which it will be difficult for any successor to replicate. Several of the Society's most useful and important publications have been issued under his Chairmanship, and they will remain reliable reference works for decades to come thanks to his scrupulous editorial oversight. The contract which Michael Lapidge drew up in 1986 between the Society and Boydell & Brewer constitutes a pivotal moment in the Society's history, and the happy working relationship which we continue to enjoy with our publisher owes much to his careful negotiations.

During the year we have welcomed Mr Andrew P. Scurr (London) and Miss Miriam M. Wendling (Cambridge) into membership of the Society.

# 5 Treasurer's report for 2011

The Independently Examined Accounts are set out below in the same format as last year. A statement of income and expenditure by volume will be available as usual at the Annual Meeting, together with the accounts to date for 2012.

As expected, bank interest was again at an historic low. The real value of our publishing reserves is reduced in consequence, although not alarmingly so. There is not much comfort in reflecting on the fact that most charities are in the same position.

The accounts show a small rise in subscription income following a fall last year due to invoicing problems.

The finances of the Society remain healthy, and well-prepared to fund the volumes in preparation.
