3 Minutes of the Annual Meeting, 16 April 2013

The one hundred and tenth Annual Meeting of the Society was held on Tuesday 16 April 2013 at 2 p.m. in the Meeting Room H of the British Library, London.

1. MINUTES

The Minutes of the one hundred and ninth Annual Meeting were received and signed.

2. COMMEMORATIONS

Commemoration was made of Michel Huglo (1921–2012), Honorary Vice-President of the Society, and of Mr Martin Burr (1953–2012), member since 1992 and member of Council since 1998. The Society also mourned the death of Professor Mechthild Gretsch (1945–2013), wife of its Vice-President Professor Helmut Gneuss.

3. STATEMENTS FROM THE CHAIR

The President commended the work of the new and retiring Chairmen of Council, and reserved especial thanks for the tireless work of the Treasurer.

4. REPORTS

The Reports of the Secretary and the Treasurer were considered.

5. ACCOUNTS

The Treasurer presented the accounts for 2012. By an oversight no Gift Aid tax reclaim was made in 2011; a double claim was therefore made in 2012. Interest rates continue to be significantly lower than the rate of inflation, thereby diminishing the real value of our reserves. Boydell & Brewer will pay royalties for the whole of 2012 by 30 June 2013, and from 1 Jan 2013 will pay the Society every six months, for periods from January to June and July to December, each being sent out within 3 months of the previous period.

6. ELECTION OF THE PRESIDENT

4 Report of the Secretary for 2013

The Society issued its 120th volume in 2013, against subscriptions for 2008. This is the second volume of Nigel Morgan's edition of English Monastic Litanies of the Saints after 1100, covering foundations arranged alphabetically from Pontefract to York. A third volume, comprising an introduction, commentary and indexes will follow next year. Meanwhile, Calvin Bower's edition of the Liber Ymnorum of Notker Balbulus is proceeding apace, and should be published in two volumes at the end of 2014. The typographical complexities of this edition have required prolonged discussion between the editor, the Publications Committee and the publisher, all of which promises a publication of the first class. The continued strengthening of our working relationship with our publishers Boydell & Brewer provides the chief means for the Society to demonstrate its public benefit, as they continue to explore new means of making our publications as widely available as possible.

During 2013 the Publications Committee has also been closely involved in the preparation of the next volume of the Society's Subsidia, our member Dr Jesse Billett's extended monograph on the Divine Office in Anglo-Saxon England. Three members of Council read through his work in detail and offered various minor comments which have now been incorporated into the text; the Society has also commissioned indexes for the book, which should be published in the next few months.

At its Council meeting last year, the Society discussed the uses to which the legacy left to us by the late Mr Martin Burr might be put. Some of these ideas will be initiated in coming months.

During the year we have welcomed five new members into the Society: Dom Benedict Andersen OSB (Stamullen, Ireland), Dr Richard Hawtree (Hindhead), Cllr David Hurley (Gravesend), the Rev'd Dr Uwe Michael Lang (The London Oratory) and Mr Jeremy John Sims (Newbury).

5 Treasurer's report for 2013

The Independently Examined Accounts are set out below in the usual format. A statement of income and expenditure by volume will be available as usual at the Annual Meeting, together with the accounts to date for 2014.

The increase in subscription income in 2013 follows a fall last year. Bank interest continues at an historic low, with a corresponding reduction in the real value of our publishing reserves. All UK charities are suffering from this, and will do until UK bank rates rise again.

The recent benefaction from Martin Burr is shown in a separate account in the Balance Sheet, pending a decision of Council as to how best to invest it, and to apply it to the purposes of the Society.

The finances of the Society remain healthy, and well-prepared to fund the volumes in preparation.

An examination included a review of the accounting records kept by the Treasurer and a comparison of the banking accounts and either source documents, or copies of same, with those records. The examination also gave consideration as to unusual items or disclosures in the accounts.
