3 Minutes of the Annual Meeting, 28 April 2015

The one hundred and twelfth Annual Meeting of the Society was held on Tuesday 28 April 2015 at 12.10 p.m. in Meeting Room K of the British Library, London.

Apologies for absence were received from Mr Patrick Clinton, Professor Helmut Gneuss, Dr Catherine Harbor, Dr Yitzhak Hen, Professor Michael Lapidge, Dr Frank Lawrence, M. Jean-Loup Lemaitre, Dr Rosalind Love, Dr Bernard Moreton, Dr Henry Parkes, the Rev'd Professor Richard Pfaff, Dom Alcuin Reid, Dr Elizabeth Robinson, Deacon James Scheer, the Rev'd Michael G. Witczak and Mr Steven Woodward.

1. MINUTES

The Minutes of the one hundred and eleventh Annual Meeting were received and signed.

2. COMMEMORATIONS

There were no commemorations.

3. STATEMENTS FROM THE CHAIR

The President thanked the Treasurer, Chairman of Council and Secretary for their work over the year, and looked forward to the discussion of the Society's future directions which would form part of the Council meeting later in the day.

4. REPORTS

The Reports of the Secretary and the Treasurer were considered.

5. ACCOUNTS

The Secretary presented the accounts on the Treasurer's behalf. No Gift Aid claim was made in 2013, but a double claim had been made for 2012-13 and 2013-14. Interest rates continue at a low ebb, so the real value of the reserves continues to shrink. The Society's Reserves Policy had been reviewed, and a revised version would be approved by Council in time for the submission of the accounts to the Charity Commission.

The meeting approved the accounts. Dr Moreton was thanked in his absence for the considerable work he had again undertaken leading to their preparation, and it was requested that the Secretary write to Mr Clinton to thank him for his independent examination of them.

6. ELECTION OF THE PRESIDENT

Abbot Cuthbert Johnson was elected President for the year 2015–16.

7. ELECTION OF A VICE-PRESIDENT

Professor Michael Lapidge was elected as an Honorary Vice-President, for an indefinite period, in recognition of his considerable service to the Society and to liturgical studies over many years.

8. ELECTION OF COUNCIL

Professor Sarah Hamilton was elected and Dr Catherine Cubitt, Dr David Pelteret and Fr Anthony Ward were re-elected to the Council for a period of three years, to serve until 2018. Additionally, Dr Helen Gittos and Dr Daniel DiCenso were elected to serve until 2017, in order to give a more even spread of retirement dates.

9. INDEPENDENT ACCOUNTS EXAMINER

The Meeting resolved to invite Mr Patrick Clinton to undertake the duties of Independent Accounts Examiner for the financial year 1 January – 31 December 2015.

10. ANNUAL MEETING 2016

The General Secretary having announced his departure from the British Library, there ensued a discussion of whether future meetings should be held elsewhere in London, or in Cambridge, where several members of the Council happen to live. It was agreed that locations could vary in future, but that the 2016 meeting should be held in London on Tuesday 26 April, at a location to be determined by the Secretary.

The Secretary later confirmed that a room in the Foundling Museum, Brunswick Square would be made available to the Society on this date.

There being no other business, the Meeting concluded at 12.40 p.m.

4 Report of the Secretary for 2015

In terms of the Society's core activity of publication, I regret to report that 2015 has been a fallow year. However, there has been a great deal of editorial activity, and this should lead to 2016 more than compensating for the apparent deficit. The third and final volume of Nigel Morgan's edition of *English Monastic Litanies of the Saints after 1100* is in its final stages of preparation, and it is hoped to submit the text to the publisher in the next few weeks. Meanwhile, Calvin M. Bower's two-volume edition of the *Liber Ymnorum* of Notker Balbulus has been completed, edited and largely typeset. The volumes are presently being prepared by the publisher, and will be sent out to members later this year.

Work has also begun on the design of a new website for the Society, which it is hoped will offer a more versatile means of disseminating information about liturgical studies.

During the year we have welcomed eight new members into the Society: Mr John W. Briggs (Waterlooville), Ms Rebecca Browett (Welwyn), Dr John R. Davies (Glasgow), Mr Paweł Figurski (Raciaz, Poland), Dr Emma Hornby (Bristol), Dr Giordano Monzio-Compagnoni (Milan), Fr John Schnakenberg OP (Oxford), and Dr Nicole Volmering (Dublin).
